1.	Welcome	INTRODUCTION The Chair, Clare Kennedy welcomed all to the meeting along with the introduction of Nigel Foster, Senior Responsible Officer for replacing Frimley Park Hospital.		
2.	Talk by Nigel Foster (NF)	SPEAKER's PRESENTATION Nigel Foster, Senior Responsible Officer for replacing Frimley Park Hospital. With a presentation entitled – The new Frimley Park Hospital. NF first went through why the hospital needs to be replaced and why it has to be on a new site. There is not enough space at the current site and the hospital needs to be built by 2030. On the current site it would take longer and be more expensive. NF said that the the hospital would be one of the new 2.0 versions, taking best practises from the UK, Europe and the rest of the world. The government has allocated 1 billion pounds for the build. NF said that they are working their way through a list of 18 possible sites but have not yet made a decision on where to build. There followed a lengthy Q&A session, too many questions to list all but some below: Q: Can the hospital be delivered on time and within budget? NF: Yes. Q: How many 2.0 hospitals have been built? NF: None at moment, this will be amongst the first. Q: Will all the staff move? NF: Hope so. Q: Is the hospital going to be on a greenfield site? NF: Cannot answer at the moment. Q: Will the new hospital have a helipad? NF: Yes it will. Q: Is funding secure? NF: Yes until 2031.		
3.	Tea Break	Was meant to be after CHAIR'S report and AGM business but due to the length of the Talk was taken earlier.		

4.	Report by the Society Chair – Clare Kennedy	CHAIR’S REPORT CK gave a brief resume of the works carried out by the Society in the last year with continued review of planning applications in the three villages, monitoring developments at Farnborough Aerodrome. The Chair appealed for new members to come forward and join the activities.		Carried
5.	Treasurers Report Carol Drew	The Income and Expenditure Accounts to year end 31/4/24 were reviewed with proposers / seconder and were approved by all. The Treasure renewed her appeal for new members to come forward and support the Society – subs either by Direct debit or payment at AGM is currently £5 per household. 6.	Election of the Committee	As per the points raised by the Chair and Treasurer, the Society would welcome new members to the Committee Formal proposal from the Chair made to elect en-bloc the existing members.		Carried
7.	Introduction of the Guests	The Chair introduced the Surrey Heath MP the Rt. Hon. Michael Gove, Councillors Jacques Olmo (JO), Morgan Rise (MR) and David Whitcroft (DW) and Police Sergeant Roxy Hudson (RH).		
8.	Police Activity summary	RH explained the current structure, an area has 2 teams, a specialist team and a response team, each headed by a sergeant. RH explained what each did adding that they are short of a PCSO as Vince Wakeling has retired. RH said there is some troubling anti-social behaviour in the area, said that it should be reported even if the police cannot get to it at once or if not to the police then to Neighbourhood Watch as the police cooperate closely with Neighbourhood Watch.		
9.	Question Time with Guests	Lively and lengthy Q&A session with MG, JO, MR, DW and RH moderated by CK. Too many questions to list all but some below: Q: Parking charges at Frimley Lodge Park? A: There are none at moment, cannot say if it might happen – being reviewed. Q: Parking outside of Frimley C of E School along Henley Drive and the Frimley Road, cars leave their engines running. A: Police are monitoring it. Q: Whats happening with the car park at the library and Medical Centre? A: SCC responsibility, PD not present. Q: What about sign banning electric scooters from the pathways on Frimley Green green. A: Will not happen – they are allowed to use the pathways. The Q: What’s happening with the new uograded roundabout in Frimley Green? A: It will go ahead but still don’t know when. Q: Do we really need an upgraded roundabout in Frimley Green? A: DW gave a long answer, it is both needed and it is part of the mitigation of the Mindenhurst development Q: Does the Bartlett Group have the capacity to service all the people coming with the new developments. A: The NHS thinks so.
